REDXA President's Report

It's traditional for columnists to write some sort of end-of-the-year summary. Here's my effort.

This year was my first as president of REDXA. Because it was a relatively painless experience--thanks to the help and cooperation of all of our members--I have re-upped for 2009. I will again be counting on you to keep REDXA among the finest regional ham radio associations.

The most difficult task facing REDXA officers is securing speakers for our monthly meetings. The generally poor HF propagation of the last few years has meant that fewer of the local DXpeditioners have gone out to rare and exotic locations, making for slim pickings for DXpedition programs. But in their place have been other fascinating programs. At this point, I'm looking for programs for March 2009. REDXA membership has remained constant, even grown a bit, over the past year. We have welcomed several new members and, sadly, mourned a few silent keys.

With a laptop running the software, Bob gave a live demo of a previous recorded contest.


