# **REDXA President's Report**

This month REDXA is privileged to hear a report on the recent P29NI IOTA expedition to Papua New Guinea. Our speaker, Alan Maenchen AD6E, was one of the members of the expedition and was at the key when he gave me my first P29 QSO on 160.

Alan was also responsible for my getting a start in Dxpedtioning. Back in 2004, Alan was scheduled to go to Banaba, T33, with a group of expeditioners with who he had previously gone to TI9M (Cocos Island). Unfortunately, Alan hurt his back and elected to stay home. In his place, he suggested that I might be a worthy addition to the team. And so it was that I wound up in my shorts and T-shirt sitting on a stack of four cases of Victoria Bitter Beer in 100 degree weather handing out T33 QSOs on CW.

I was especially proud after the expedition when the leader, Hrane, YT1AD, told me how surprised he was that I actually knew a thing or two about running a pileup. Before getting to Banaba, he assumed that I was just coming along to be the expedition doctor (I did that too).

I turned 65 last month. To put it another way, it's been 53 years since I received novice license KN6SRZ and began operating from the RF black hole of Mill Valley's Homestead Valley.

Anyhow, last month ham radio activities took a back seat to the business of becoming a "senior". First, I had to deal with Social Security and with Kaiser to turn my Kaiser membership into something called "Medicare Senior Advantage". Next, I had to navigate a bewildering array of options with my retirement plans. And every morning I had to stand in front of the bathroom mirror and ask myself if it was really true that I was SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OLD! How could this be? The "inner me" was still a healthy teenager. The outer me, however, was slowly recognizing that—if family history is any guide—I had only about twenty more years to accomplish whatever I could in this life.

Now, one of the things I want to accomplish—besides curing cancer and realizing world peace—is becoming number 1 on the DXCC Honor Roll. It's going to be tough. For one thing, I was off the air from 1962 to 1996. I just missed the VK0IR expedition, my one QSO with Yemen (and it was with Yemen) didn't count, and there are two French islands in the Indian Ocean that haven't been activated for a long, long time.

Let's be honest: despite commendable efforts to bring youth into ham radio, HF Dxing is largely the province of the middle-aged or older. We are dinosaurs, albeit happy ones.

My own modest proposal to the DXCC program would be to change the rules so that if an entity is not activated within ten years, that entity should be removed from the current list and back-burnered. When it is again activated, it can go back on the list, and those who were fortunate to have worked the entity many years before would have their credit restored.

It probably won't happen, so I'll have to be content with discounts at the movies, AMTRAK, and coffee at McDonald's to name but a few (there's a Web site, www.seniordiscounts.com that) claims to have 15,000 listed senior discounts. And, if I can hold until I'm 76, I'll be eligible to ski free at Squaw Valley. The Squaw Valley discount is a tribute to modern medicine, I guess, since it used start at age 70.


he retired. I hope many of you will be able to attend this year's Pacificon. More information is available at cpacificon.org.
