SEPTEMBER MEETING PRESENTATION DETAILS

Improve Rate Using N1MM's Spot Capabilities

Presented by N4XL

Surprisingly, many contesters are unaware of the tools offered by N1MM to effectively find workable stations using Search and Pounce. Whether you operate from a Multi-Multi Super Station, have a modest 100 watt Little Pistol setup with a low tribander and wires, or live in an HOA controlled development using compromised antennas, you can improve your scores by using these tips. SO2R operators have also benefited by more productively using their second radio. Although geared primarily towards Assisted operators, ideas for those who prefer to avoid clusters will also be presented.

Topics include:

- Tools available within N1MM to identify workable stations
- Program options which maximize the benefit of the Mult and Q window spot usefulness
- Indicators offered within the program to help determine when switching from run to S&P or if changing bands will be more productive
- Effective use of N1MM's Band Scope feature
- · Keyboard shortcuts to quickly navigate to your next multiplier

Questions both during and after the presentation are encouraged.

Parks on the Air (POTA)

Off and on during the last couple of years I have been enjoying operating in the Parks on the Air Program. After having a great deal of fun during the 2016 National Parks Centennial event sponsored by ARRL (National Parks on the Air-NPOTA) I discovered POTA. National parks, state parks, recreation areas national forests, historic landmarks etc, have all been assigned a four digit number designation. The program is worldwide. All parks in USA begin with the letter K. For example locally there is Armstrong Redwoods Reserve State Conservation Area K-3398

Hams go to the various parks to "activate" them. 10 qsos is the minimum for a official activation but all qsos count. The hams calling are known as "chasers or "hunters". There seems to be quite an interest in both activating and hunting. For those of us who enjoy portable operating it is right up our alley. I have done a couple of activations and have worked many here from home. More detailed information can be found on the web site: pota.app (ex. <u>pota.us</u>) I hope to activate some parks on my journey across the USA and Canada (as we speak). Keep an ear open for me and watch the spots page on their web site.

California QSO Party - Next Month!

By the time you read this, it will be less than a month until the most popular state QSO Party on the contest calendar. And this year's event brings significant rules changes for the club competition.

As you may remember, REDXA *finally* won the Small Club Competition last year after many years of trying. A real rivalry had developed between us and the Mother Lode DX/Contest Club as well as the Pizza Lovers 259 (PL259 for short).

And, as they say, all good things must come to an end... the club competition rules have now be changed for 2021! Briefly, the old alignment of clubs has given way a new stratification based on size. To quote the new rules (from http://www.cqp.org/Clubcomp.html):

"There are 5 categories of California clubs and 5 categories of non-California clubs. [Emphasis is mine.] Categories are based on the number of logs received by each club. To commemorate California's stunning natural landscape, five U.S. National Parks located inside California were selected as club category names. Spanning California from the northwest to the southeast corners of the state, these national parks include forests, mountains, vast desert wilderness, islands in the Pacific Ocean, towering waterfalls, granite cliffs and the tallest trees on Earth. Just as these national parks are different from each other, so too are amateur radio clubs. CQP Club Category names attempt to cherish this fact and to represent different levels of club participation."

Further the breakdown is summarized in this table:

CQP Club Category	Number of Logs per Club	
Yosemite	31+	_
Joshua Tree	21-30	
Sequoia	11-20	
Redwood	6-10	
Channel Islands	1-5	

Further, there are some other interesting features - bonus points for California County Expedition stations participating within the club. Read the full rules from the website.

Bottom line: everyone that can get on the air should do so and submit a log for REDXA. And more importantly - have fun!
