How I got Started in Ham Radio

Rick Sealock N6GY "How I Became a Ham".....

I have been licensed in radio for 40 years. Amateur Radio for 26 years.

I hold Commercial NARTE Senior Technician -Master Certification with AM/FM Broadcast Radio Endorsements and have worked at the Pacific Telephone Radio

And Television Operating Center, San Francisco.

I have held Novice, Technician, General, and now Extra Class tickets. Like many others, I got interested in CB radio. Especially Santa Monica REACT (KFR9525 and KIK0588). Then a true Southern Gentleman from South Carolina, Otice "Red" Gallman KF6D (sk) introduced me to "ham" radio. He helped me buy my first radio, a Yaesu 101EX. Later I transferred to San Jose where I was involved in Santa Clara County REACT. When I transferred to Sonoma County, Gary Jackman [KF6JF/ W6GWJ (sk)] tormented me daily until I took and passed my Novice test.

My first HF QSO was with Dr. Robert (Bob) Hisamoto KL7AM (sk) on 10M SSB. We chatted a while. Only later did I find out he was considered the "Father of Japanese Radio". He had formally petitioned Emperor Hirohito to allow "Amateur Radio" into Japan in 1932.

Other interesting QSO's were my first CW (at "about" 5wpm) with Chuck KB6IXB (sk) in April 1987. I also managed to talk to Tom Christian on Pitcairn Isl. on 10M SSB.

I later got my Technician license, then gave up HF while raising our son, who played competitive soccer from age 4 to age 18, when he was invited to try out for the Men's Olympic Development Team in 2005. Meanwhile, I concentrated on VHF/UHF Public Service.

I got re-interested in HF about 4 years ago. I struggled with a Hustler Vertical on top of the roof, learning how to listen, closely, because I couldn't hear very well.. I managed DXCC despite having a dead radio receive for 3 months. (Bad filters). Thanks to Chuck N6OJ who convinced me they were bad, and to Kenwood for replacing the filters free (although they were 3 years out of warranty). Finally early last year, I put up the tower and the 3

ele STEPPIR that I enjoy today. Currently WAC, WAS, WAS-RTTY, DXCC (240). 5,201 QSO's - 2,446 QSL's. I am doing SSB, CW, RTTY, PSK31, JT-65, VHF-SSB/FM, UHF-FM/ATV I credit Red KF6D(sk), Gary W6GWJ (sk), Chuck N6OJ, Len K6ANP, and Ron N6IE for getting me this far!
