**K6SRZ** - Started on 10 M and got nada for a few minutes so I moved on to greener pastures.

**K6MM** - Definitely a personal best for me. Off to a great start on 15m with 250 Qs after just the first two hours. Great band conditions on 15m, which was open most of the day.

Tried calling CQ on 10m several times --- N6TV, N5KO, and later K7HP (AZ) came back, but I didn't feel the band opening up at all, so I stayed on 15m and 20m before switching to 40m. 80m was a bit noisy and I forgot about 160m altogether -- probably left a few mults on the table.

First contest using an Apple Bluetooth keyboard with N1MM and Windows XP. I think it's a MUCH better solution that the standard external keyboard.

Low-profile aluminum case. Small footprint. Big, fat keys. Shorter contact time. Very responsive. Less fatigue. Quiet. Secure feeling when typing. Fewer mistakes.

It may just be my imagination, but I think it actually improved my performance today. Love that keyboard. Also use it with our iPad.

NAQP CW is always a fun contest. Thanks for all the "KB" QSOs.

**N6ZFO** - 10 m a big disappointment . . K6LRN and KC0W/m (ND) were only Q's; nothing else heard except an HK1. Must have been an Es opening into ND; worked KC0W pre-contest w/ big signal. Later, he called me on 15m and moved to 10 at my request, where we had an easy Q w/ 599 sigs. But

## **DX News** by Jim, K6JS

Average daily sunspot numbers this week were up over 47 points to 99.3. Average daily solar flux rose nearly 35 points to 131.7.

Solar flux jumped from 139.8 on Tuesday, July 31 to 150.1 on Wednesday, August 1. Predicted solar flux is 135 on August 3-4, 130 on August 5-6, 125 on August 7-9, 130 on August 10-11, and 120 on August 12-13. Solar flux is expected to drop below 100 on August 16-21. Predicted planetary A index is 8 on August 3, 5 on August 4-19, 8 on August 20-21, 5 on August 22-23, then 8, 8, 12 and 8 on August 24-27.

At the beginning of August we have some new sunspot data from our 3-month moving average. The three-month moving averages centered on January through June 2012 are 83.3, 73.7, 71.2, 87.3, 91.5, and 96.5. The average centered on June 2012 is every daily sunspot number from May 1

through July 31 added together, then divided by the number of days, which is 92. You could say that this latest number is the 3-month trailing average, or the 3-month average centered on June.

The Northern California DX Foundation is pleased to announce the addition of two new Directors to fill vacancies created by retiring board members. Tom Berson ND2T and Glenn Rattmann K6NA were elected to fill these positions.

Tom Berson ND2T became a ham at the age of 11. He has lived and worked abroad for 7 ½ years. He is a past president and director of the International Association for Cryptologic Research, Inc. Professionally, Tom is an expert in cryptography, computer security, information conflict, and high-tech business. Tom has been on several high profile DXpeditions and will be headed to NH8S Swains Island very soon. Tom has lived in Palo Alto, CA, since 1977.

Glenn Rattmann K6NA has been DXing and contesting since age 14. He has a degree in Marine Geology and has had successful careers in oceanographic survey work, electronic sales and manufacturing and aerospace. He retired from Northrop Grumman in 2007. He has participated in many DXpeditions and is very active in contesting. He has worked all current DX entities and loves the low bands. He has been very active in the San Diego DX Club. 
