He mentioned the Club would be participating as a club in the ARRL 10M Contest on December 8th and 9th.

Jim was asked about our score at CQP, and he said he didn't know. He tried "mining" the logs, but didn't come to a figure that was accurate. He did mention that in FIELD DAY we had placed 1st in Pacific Division Category 2A, and 5th Nationally. (We were the only station west of the Mississippi in the top 5.) :-)

Alan spoke about the KPH station and their Rhombic 209 antenna, built sometime in the late 1930's. They are trying to restore it. He requests anyone interested come out to visit when they are open on Saturdays and sign in on the log, thereby showing an interest in the station to the National Parks Service. They need to show support for the site, and raise \$4,000 to repair portions of it, or lose it forever. All visits and or donations greatly appreciated.

Doug WW6D commented that it was a great tour, and that he thinks we would all enjoy it.

This months meeting was elections month. The motion was made to re-elect all the officers to their respective current positions. Motion was seconded and passed unanimously with no votes against.

Ron N6IE gave a very enjoyable presentation about the various ways we could operate our HF stations remotely.

Whether "vacation" remotely, point to point remotely, or using another hams station remote, using WIFI, 3G/4G, Cable, the Internet, or 900 Mhz like he does. He did a slide presentation showing the methods, equipment, and processes to make that happen. He also offered to waive his usual consulting fee to any member that was interested in setting that up, HI HI!

Contesting

Tis the Season of contesting!

The year is just running by, and now we are full swing in the holiday season, searching and pouncing on holiday deals. Over the past few months we have enjoyed quite a bit of contesting and DX chasing. We've been very competitive and put up some nice scores in Field day, CQP and the 10 meter contests. The CQP and the Sweepstakes contests are now completed for this year and we can certainly affirm that contest season is upon us. There is not much time left in 2012, but just enough for the 10 meter contest as well as a pair of very good 160 meter contests (ARRL 160 and the Stew Perry). DXCC Reminder: the end-of-the-year tally with the DXCC Desk is approaching. Be sure to keep your DXCC records up to date!

Bob K6QXY has now confirmed 170 DXCC countries on 6 meters! A truly remarkable accomplishment. On November 7th he worked EA8/G8BCG CANARY Island on an EME Qso for DXCC #170 after several years of skeds. Note: ARRL 10 meter contest ended right at the deadline for this column. Look for members' results next month.

I write this a few hours after working a couple hundred QSOs in the ARRL 10 meter contest, where conditions were frustrating. It was a pleasure to hear and work so many REDXA members in the contest. Friday night was a worked all REDXA on back scatter. I logged at least 10 REDX'ers and heard many others. If we submit over 10 logs we will be competing in the Medium club category. One of the caveats of the local club category (<10 logs) is a 35 mile circle. The medium club (>10 and <50 logs) category supports the traditional 175 mile circle.

Conditions were frustrating to say the least with an SFI hovering around 100. It's hard to believe that I missed most if not all 0 and 7 call areas, while Texas was almost non-existent. I did manage to get 233 Qso's and 77 multipliers for a score of 64,372. 185 CW and 48 SSB QSO's. The numbers break down with 17 California, 15 Florida, 13 Ohio stations and 64 DX Q's. The remainder consists of stateside multipliers. Stations were there one minute and gone the next. A few VK's and ZL's ended the evening Saturday night, but no JA's up to that point. Sunday conditions improved and it was nice to get the JA opening at the end of the contest.


