JANUARY 2017 MEETING MINUTES by Rick, N6GY

The January REDXA meeting was held at the Boulevard Café at 7pm on Wednesday January 11th. There were approximately 45 members in attendance. The guest speaker was Chris Tate N6WM.

An announcement was made from Treasurer Bill W6IYS, that the roster now has 73 members, but only 45 members have paid their dues for 2017. The Club slightly overspent their money for Christmas raffle items, but the raffle was very successful, and the Club Treasury now has a balance of \$3,850.

The Board of Directors were polled via email previously by Ron N6IE about using the "monkey ranch" as a Field Day site for 2017, like we did in 2016. The Board had unanimously given their approval, although the price was raised to \$750 for the weekend. This is \$300 more than was charged last year. President Bill WX6B asked for a show of hands from anyone AGAINST the Club operating from there, and no one complained.

Ron N6IE has repeatedly tried to get an OK from the Marin Club, who usually shares our site, but was unsuccessful in getting any replies. Rich W6UDS said he would try to get an answer from them

Chris Tate asked to be a REDXA Club member, and was unanimously voted in.

Jim K6JS announced he had two radios for sale. A IC7700 for \$3,500 and a TS-570D for \$500.

The 50-50 raffle took in \$229 and \$114 was won by John K6VXI.

After dinner, Chris Tate N6WM gave his slide presentation on Software Defined Radios, and their ability to search multiple band segments for winning Contests.
