FEBRUARY MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President Bill (WX6B).

President Bill announced that we had two new applicants for membership in the club and briefly introduced them both. The applicants were Stu Clark.(WA6BTK) and Gary Pinyan (N2BBB). In accordance with the By-Laws a vote was held and both applicants were approved and welcomed as members of REDXA.

President Bill then briefly reviewed the club's activity in the recent CQP contest. He also reminded members of the upcoming DX Convention in Visalia scheduled for April 15-17. He then called for a Treasurer's report from Bill (W6IYS) who reported that the closing balance for the month of January was \$4471.11. He also cited the work done by Al (K6RIM) in contacting more than two dozen members and reminding them to send in their dues,. President Bill then asked for approval of the minutes of the last meeting and Treasurer's report. Both were approved without objection...

There was brief discussion regarding participation in ClubLog including some discussion of the Leaderboard system provided by them. Following that discussion Chuck (N6OJ) suggested that REDXA make a cash donation to Clublog. Fred (N6YEU) reminded everyone that our past practice has been to donate funds to NCDXF and to allow them to allocate funds as they deemed appropriate. A motion to contribute \$250 each to ClubLog and NCDXF was made by Frank((KG6N) seconded by Rick (N6GY). The motion was approved unanimously.

Al (K6RIM) suggested that we consider making the club roster available on line for all REDXA members. He further suggested that the data be password protected and that any member be allowed to

opt out of the system if he/she wished to do so. There was a general consensus that this arrangement would be satisfactory and Doug (WW6D),, webmaster for the Club,stated that he would put a notice in SunSpots next month to alert all members of the new policy.

President Bill then recessed the formal meeting to dinner.

Following dinner Bob (K6QXY) presented a program detailing his extensive operations on 6 meters and especially his EME experience. The program featured slides, charts and videos of his more than 30 years experience in the field.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:00 pm.

The FCC Database has much of this data and, with the help of search engines, the rest can be easily found.
