## GROWING HAM RADIO -WRONG EMPHASIS

Several organizations take great pride in the number of people who take their test preparation, often one day classes. And, they point out the large proportion of those who pass their ham exams. (One Day Wonders!) They fail to take into account the LARGE proportion of newly licensed hams that NEVER do anything with their new license, and often fail to upgrade, before their license expires. I feel the emphasis must be put on those that pass AND become active hams!

Some say that the equipment is too expensive. My first radio was a Yaesu FT-101E that cost me three months salary to purchase in 1972. Think what three months salary will buy you TODAY!!!! Usually a complete station with a tower, antenna, tuner, etc.!

Others say they only got licensed in case of emergencies. How well prepared will they be if an emergency happens? With no knowledge of how to adequately work their radios, antenna basics, or propagation factors, they become what we in the Emergency Services Field call "convergent volunteers". They are only useful under the direct supervision of more experienced hams, trained in Emergency Services. Having someone who doesn't know how to operate their or others equipment is NOT AN ASSET!

Some say they just want to contact their family and loved ones. In an emergency, they KNOW that their cell phones will be all but useless. They will be dismayed to find that the VHF-UHF bands will be clogged with emergency traffic. They will find the repeaters and simplex frequencies will be unavailable to them because of the large amounts of traffic, and those that want to know the latest of what's going on. Even HF (which requires greater knowledge of bands and propagation) will be confusing to them.

The answer lies in supporting the new hams with help ("Elmering") and support. We need to introduce them to the fun and rewards in rag chewing, chasing DX, emergency preparedness, antenna building, chasing DXpeditions, working short and long "skip", and/or participating in ham club activi-
