REDXA President's Report

May Meeting Program

For our May 14 meeting we are privileged to have a return visit from Jim Brown, K9YC. Jim's topic will be "Computer to Radio Interfacing Without Pain".

Jim writes "most hams (including authors of some ARRL publications) believe that transformers, expensive boxes, or even optical isolators are needed to connect computers and other gear to transceivers without hum and buzz. This is sadly (and expensively) wrong, and so are many of the solutions offered. An unshielded transformer or an improper shield connection may CAUSE hum, buzz, and RFI!

"[My] presentation shows simple and effective solutions, involving no more than a few feet of copper braid and properly wired cables that can connect anything to anything, without transformers, interface boxes, or optical isolators. Audio connections are addressed first, followed by rig control, sending CW, PTT, and RTTY."

Where are those sunspots?

The tower is up, the 3-element SteppIR is in place, and everything at K6SRZ Penngrove appears to be working just fine. Unfortunately, the sun is not cooperating. The solar flux is stuck somewhere around 70 (65 is about as low as it ever goes) and DX on 15 meters and above is just a memory. Looking through my old paper logs, I am amused to see page after page of QSO's with Europe on 10 meters and perhaps 60 separate DXCC entities worked with 5 watts way back in the early days of the 21st Century. Let us hope that those days come again soon.

In the meantime, what's a DXer to do?

The usual suggestions are to use the days of poor propagation to improve antennas, clean up the shack, and reconnect with friends and family. These are all good suggestions. I have another: consider getting more exercise.

A recent New York Times article quotes Dr. Frank Yu of the Harvard School of Public Health as saying "the single thing that comes close to a magic bullet, in terms of its strong and universal [health] benefits, is exercise."

Studies have shown exercise lowers the risk of "heart attack, stroke, hypertension, diabetes, obesity, depression, dementia, osteoporosis, gallstones, diverticulitis, falls, ED, peripheral vascular disease, and twelve kinds of cancer..." Further, exercise can improve the quality of life for folks who suffer from arthritis, Parkinson's disease, congestive heart failure, diabetes, and depression.

If you aren't a regular exerciser and you'd like to try something, the place to start is by talking with your doctor and choosing a form of exercise that's right for you.

One of the major predictors of success in amateur radio contesting is the ability to keep one's butt in the chair—the BIC factor--for hours on end. Success in exercise is just the opposite: the ability to get the rear end off the couch and out the door. Both can be fun!

Bob WB6VEX, Emeritus Seismology Researcher at UC Berkeley then presented the program on Earthquakes. The parallels with amateur radio were very interesting. Their "receivers" pick up the waves from the earth instead of the electromagnetic waves of radio. The dynamic range of a seismograph in the 80's was advanced from the previous 60 dB to 96 dB with the move to digital. Up until then, the seismograph was the commonly viewed "paper on the drum" that we all see in the media. Current methods provide around 160 dB of dynamic range but 240 dB is needed to see the weakest waves all the way up to the large ones. So, like our ham receivers, attenuation is used to cover the DR needed.

Bob also encouraged people to check out Project Earthscope (earthscope.org) – an interesting web site for tracking earthquakes and volcanoes.

Meeting adjourned at 9:20 pm.


