REDXA President's Report

Reverse Beacon Network (RBN) by Bob Wilson N6TV

Our May presentation will be given by Bob Wilson, N6TV. He will be presenting a tutorial on the Reverse Beacon Network. The RBN is a revolutionary new idea with a network of stations listening to the bands and reporting what stations they hear, when they hear them and how well they are heard. The RBN is not a traditional spotting network. It is comprised of volunteer skimmer stations some of which operate 24/7 while others only operate occasionally.

RBN allows you to see band openings in near-real time on an animated map. You can call a quick CQ, and see which reverse beacons hear you, and the strength of your signal. You can also compare your signal with those of your friends and competitors, in near-real time or historically. You can instantly find out what stations from a given country or zone has been heard, at what times and on what frequencies. You can see when you've been spotted, who spotted you, and how loud you were. If you wonder how your signal stacked up during last weekend's contests, the Signal Comparison Tool will give you real, quantitative data. Tell it what stations you want to compare based on signals heard by a given reverse beacon on a certain band at a certain time.

The RBN is another tool for contesters and DXers as new technology continues to be integrated with our hobby. Please join us at Cattlemen's in Petaluma for some camaraderie and an exciting presentation by TV Bob.

The 63rd International DX convention is now history. I haven't heard if the REDXA raffle luck rubbed off on any members that attended. We've had a few big winners the last few years. I was unable to attend this year due to family matters.

Ron explained President Jim K6JS would not be present because of a death in his family. A sympathy card was passed and signed by the attendees.

A motion was made to accept the March minutes as published in "SUNSPOTS" and the Treasury Report as well. Seconded and passed.

Ron announced the May meeting would feature Bob N6TV. The June meeting would be about Field Day.

Old Business- because of the negotiations in process, this meeting was held at Gourmet Garden, but the next meeting we will try to get it at Cattlemen's in Petaluma per the members wishes.

Alan K6SRZ is replacing Rick N6RNO as the NCCC CQP "Czar". He will try to get the CQP results posted to the REDXA reflector asap. He may be looking for volunteer log checkers after this years CQP. He requests all logs be submitted in Cabrillo format soon after the upcoming CQP in October.

There was some discussion on cut off dates.

New Business-

Field Day -Jim KE6UAR is co-captain of the upcoming Field Day with Doug from the Marin Club.

Jim is leaving the country for a month, planning to return in early June. He requests that others do the advanced planning necessary before the Field Day Event. They have already decided to put up three towers, two with STEPPIR's and one with the "Shorty Forty" with the newly purchased M2 6M 3 element beam on top.

Wire antennas would be added as needed.

We only have two more meetings before Field Day, and the June meeting is shortly before Field Day. Jim requests that club members meet at the Marin Rod and Gun Club on Friday June 22nd at 11am to put the towers up. He will be going to Fred's to get the antennas and club equipment on the 15th.

We will be running 2A. Ron N6IE would oversee the SSB - Bruce W6OSP would do the same for CW. The Marin club would do the 6M VHF.

There would be no GOTA station this year unless the Marin Club provided it.

N1MM would be the logging system used, because of it's success in the past.

Also a new, quiet generator will be provided for FD by the Marin Club, allowing it to be placed closer to the operating positions.

Jim K6UUW reminded members of the upcoming VOMARC breakfast/swap meet at the Sonoma Vets Building on Saturday April 28th. Talk in on 145.350 (pl 88.5) repeater.

The 50-50 raffle was held and collected \$61. Jim KE6UAR took home \$30.

The presentation was done by Chuck N6OJ regarding LOTW. He covered the basics of how to get started. He also said that most modern logging programs work well with LOTW, some only requiring 4 mouse clicks to upload.

He displayed a slide show that covered the important parts, including one that showed even a caveman could do it. Bruce W6OSP was not amused. Chuck then showed a collated slide show of some of the pictures he took on his South Pacific Cruise, visiting the Marquesas, the Kiribats, Cook Island, Bora Bora, and Tahiti.

YEMEN, 70. A group of operators are QRV as 706T from Socotra Island, IOTA AF-028, until May 15. Activity is on 160 to 10 meters using CW, SSB and RTTY with six stations active simultaneously. QSL via UA3DX.

MOZAMBIQUE, C9. Daniel, ZS6JR and Dior, ZS6DJD, are QRV as C91JR and either C91JD, C91DJ or C91DN, respectively, from a park lake near Shai Shai until around May 14. Activity is on 40 to 10 meters, and possibly 80 and 6 meters. QSL via operators' instructions.

SWITZERLAND, HB. Members of the Tera Radio Club will be QRV using special event station HB100FLP from May 7 to June 9 during the 100th anniversary of the Railway Lugano. Activity will be on all bands and modes. QSL via HB9OCR.

JORDAN, JY. Paolo, IK0BOU is QRV as JY9ET from Amman. Activity is generally on 80 to 10 meters using CW and SSB from around 1400 to 2100z daily and at anytime during the weekends. QSL via M0OXO.

BULGARIA, LZ. Special event station LZ67VZ will be QRV from May 5 to 9 to commemorate the World War II Bulgarian General Vladimir Zaimov. Activity will be on the HF bands, including EME on 70 cm and 13 cm. QSL via operators' instructions.

NETHERLANDS, PA. Frans, PC2F is QRV using special event station PC25HR from May 6 to 28 from the Hertog Reijnout pumping stations as part of Holland's National Windmill Day. QSL to home call.

EUROPEAN RUSSIA, UA. Special event station R1945HS is active during the month of May in remembrance of the end of WW II 67 years ago. QSL direct via RW6HS.

UKRAINE, UR. Members of the Crimean Contest Radio Club are QRV using special event call EM67J until May 15 in remembrance of the end of WW II 67 years ago. QSL via K2PF.

GIBRALTAR, ZB. Operators Mike, ZB3M and Ed, ZB2ER will be QRV as ZQ3M and ZQ2ER, respectively, from May 5 to June 10 to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee. QSL both calls direct via ZB3M.

Six meter report from Bob K6QXY.

Bob continues to work numerous ZL's, VK's and into the Pacific around 2300z to 0000Z.Bob states this is the end of the F2/TEP season and the start of the ES season. I wish I could hear just one of these stations :)

Propagation report from K7RA

Solar activity revived over the past week, with a big increase in sunspot numbers. On Friday, April 20, the daily sunspot number reached 162, and four days later on April 24 the number reached 169. This level of activity was not seen since last fall, when the daily sunspot number reached 173 on September 16, 184 on October 21, and 208 on November 9.

Average daily sunspot numbers more than doubled over the previous week's average, rising 73 points to 144.7. Average daily solar flux was 133.9, an increase of nearly 29 points.

Associated with all this was a rise in geomagnetic activity, peaking with a planetary A index of 35 on Tuesday, April 24. The geomagnetic activity increase was due to several solar flares launched from new sunspots.

The latest forecast shows solar flux of 115 on April 27, 110 on April 28, 105 on April 29-30, 100 on May 1-2, 95 on May 3, 105 on May 4, 110 on May 5-6, 115 on May 7-8, 120 on May 9, 130 on May 10-12, 135 on May 13, 140 on May 14-17, 135 on May 18-21, followed by 130, 125, 120, 115 and 110 on May 22-26 and 105 on May 27-31.

Predictions for planetary A index are 10 on April 27, 5 on April 28 through May 1, 8 on May 2, 5 on May

3-7, 8, 12, 15 and 10 on May 8-11, 5 on May 12-19, 12 and 10 on May 20-21, and 5 on May 27-31. Thanks to ARRL, OPDX, K7RA and QRZ DX. Additional information can be found online.


