For November's meeting we are honored to have a presentation by CW contester extraordinaire Bob Wilson, N6TV.

CW may be a primitive binary digital language, but as practiced by N6TV, cw is technological tour de force with SO2R. Bob will talk about the new and controversial VE3NEA CW xkimmer technology. I really enjoyed seeing the photos of CQP operations that we shared at the October meeting. I am four DXCC entities short of having worked them all. Until somebody activates FR/G, FR/T, VK0 (Heard), and Yemen (well, I did work Yemen, but you all know *that* story!), I will remain four entities short. So, like so many other DXers, I stay active chasing band-countries and entering contests. My latest obsession is 160 meters. When I lived on a small lot in Berkeley, Top Band was not a serious option. Now that I have enough space for some modest low band antennas (1.01 acres, according to the deed) and the nights are getting longer, I am spending more time on that band.

The most frustrating aspect of working 160 is hearing a DX station calling CQ over and over again while the stateside pileup gets bigger and nobody gets through.
