# **REDXA President's Report**

PSE QSL OM! Ron, N6IE, pinch-hitting for President Jim

Ever since my first day as a Novice I have enjoyed sending and receiving QSL cards. Cards from everywhere, including not just the exotic DXCC entities, but from hams wherever they happen to be operating, even if it's just from across town. Over the years, I have found many of the cards to be very creative, unusual and often offering some insight into the location and the operator. Long ago, I ran out of wall space to display them on.

In the early days of ham radio, QSL'ing a first-time contact with any station was considered proper etiquette, and you could pretty much count on getting a card if you asked during the QSO. DX stations would often QSL even without the SAE + green stamp. The cards were a nicety, but also a requirement for numerous awards including the coveted DXCC.

Part of the challenge of QSL'ing was getting the proper address, and many folks remember the big book with the winged horse on the cover, which was the primary source. Every US and Canadian ham was listed along with some DX, but many countries wouldn't share their information, making the search for the right address a challenge.

Although the book was updated and published quarterly, if you didn't have the latest copy, you often got old, out-of-date addresses. QSL managers, QSL nets and QSL bureaus, both incoming and outgoing, all became part of the scheme in what often became a long process.

One big thing that has changed over the years is the cost, especially in many parts of EU where an airmail letter costs close to \$3.00 USD. There was always the chance that your green stamp could get stolen by a corrupt postal worker in a foreign country, and although the incidence of this is less than in the old days, it still goes on. Add the cost of outgoing postage, envelopes and card printing, and the fact that many QSL requests go unanswered, and the cost of getting a basic DXCC has soared. Not to mention all the trees that have been sacrificed in the process!

Well now, thanks to computers, the internet and the ARRL, we have a much better, faster and more accurate way of confirming our QSO's: Logbook of The World, or "LoTW". I have been using the service for a few years now, but I'm still overwhelmed at the complicated series of events it requires to initially sign up, and to use all of the various facets of LoTW. At our April meeting, we will have QSL expert Chuck, N6OJ give a presentation on how to get started with LoTW and how to use it to get the most benefit. Bring your questions for what should be a very important session, Wednesday, April 11th!


