REDXA had numerous folks in the NAQP CW contest. I worked it for a few hours that I had free. It was mainly a 15M effort using the K3 and an inverted vee at 30'. I heard K6RIM and worked K6SRZ a couple times. Conditions were pretty good, nothing on 10M at all for me. The contest scores only reflect the stations that sent me their scores.

Online certificates <http://cqww.com/blog/?p=205> are now available for CQ WW DX Contest of 2012 and later. All entrants may download a certificate as Adobe PDF files and print it on their own computer. (Thanks, CQ WW DX Contest Director, Randy K5ZD)

Bill N3RR is publishing an ongoing account <http://users.erols.com/n3rr/> of his conversion from a one-radio contester to SO2R (Single-Op, Two Radios). You may find the discussion if you are wrestling with similar issues or contemplating such an upgrade to your own station.

The propagation prediction software ZoneProp <http://www.radiosport.ca/zoneprop/> produces a 40 zone by 40 zone matrix that is updated hourly at approximately 20 minutes past the hour. The intersection between a row and column gives the band on which a contestant in the zone represented by the row is mostly likely able to contact a contestant in the zone represented by the column. Note that the model on which ZoneProp is built (known as REC533) is intended for long-term averages - don't expect it to reflect short-term changes in conditions. That's what your brain is for! (Thanks, Syl VE5ZX, Rick ZL2HAM, and Dave AB7E)

MAURITIUS, 3B8. 3B8/HB9ARY is QRV until August 11. Look for him on 1830 kHz on CW at local sunrise, 0130Z. He expects to return to 3B8 every six months. QSL direct via HB9ARY or through the Swiss bureau.

GREENLAND, OX. Station OX5YL will be a group of YL operators QRV from August 16-20. At the radios will be HL1KDW, JR3MVF, LA6RHA, SM6KAT and WA0WOF. QSL direct or via bureau to PA5YL.

CANARY ISLANDS, EA8. Bob, DL7VOA will be operating as EA8/DL7VOA until August 17. Listen for him during his evenings mostly on CW. QSL to DL7VOA, direct or via the Bureau. Members of the Grupo DX Gran Canaria and URE Las Palmas will be active as AO8LH from Puna de la Aldea Lighthouse. Activity will be on all HF bands using CW, SSB and RTTY. QSL via EA8AKN and LoTW. Andrew, G7COD, will be active as EA8/home call from Gran Canaria from August 9-31. Activity will be on 30 through 6 meters using CW and SSB. QSL via his home call

sign, direct, by the Bureau or eQSL and LoTW.

ALAND ISLAND, OH0. OH0/DM2ECM, will be active until August 16. His main activity is meteor scatter work during the peak of the Perseids meteor shower, with a random operating schedule and plan.

RODRIGUEZ ISLAND, 3B9. The Verona DX Team will be QRV for EME activity on 144 and 432 MHz as well as HF operations from September 1-9. The team is currently awaiting approval of the call sign 3B9EME. Operators include Walter, I3VJW; Luc, I3LDP; Rony, IZ3KIF and Alessandro, IK5MIC. 9M2, WEST MALAYSIA (Update IOTA/LH Op!). Activity will be on all HF bands using CW, SSB and RTTY. The ARLHS number is currently unassigned. QSL via EA8AKN and LoTW.

EH200, SPAIN (Special Event). Members of the Union de Radioaficionados de Donostia (URD) will activate the Spanish special event station EH200D from La Mota Castle between August 24-25th, and then again from the URD HQ (EA2URD) between August 31st and September 1st. Activity is to commemorate the bicentenary of the reconstruction of Donostia- San Sebastian. QSL via EA2URD. Solar Update

Propagation Predictor Tad "Sol Man" Cook, K7RA, in Seattle, reports: Solar indicators barely moved this week, with average daily sunspot numbers up 5.8 points to 85.4, and average daily solar flux down 2.4 points to 107.3. Predicted solar flux for the next

week is also unchanged, with the predicted average for Thursday August 8 through Wednesday August 14 at 107.9, hardly different from 107.3 this past week.

Solar flux is predicted at 110 on August 8-11, 105 on August 12-14, 110 and 115 on August 15-16, 110 on August 17-18, 105 on August 19-24, 110 on August 25-28, 115 on August 29, 105 on August 30 through September 2, 110 on September 3-4, and 115 on September 5-12.

Predicted planetary A index is 8, 12, 18 and 10 on August 8-11, 5 on August 12-13, then 12 and 8 on August 14-15, 5 on August 16-20, then 10, 15 and 10 on August 21-23, 5 on August 24-30, then 12, 17, 8, 5 and 8 on August 31 through September 4, 5 on September 5-9, and 8 on September 10-11.

Friday's bulletin will respond to a flood of e-mail concerning our Sun's shifting magnetic polarity, and will update the latest daily forecast for solar flux and A index.




