Contesting

REDXA and the ARRL 10 Meter Contest this weekend.

The ARRL 10-Meter Contest is this weekend from 0000Z, Dec 14 to 2359Z, Dec 15. Please try to clear some time on your calendar and give REDXA some points. This contest is pretty much a daytime affair, so it leaves some time for the family.

We entered this contest as a club last year and had a nice turnout of members. It was a good contest for REDXA to enter in the club competition and we just missed winning the "local" club category, once again being edged out by the MLDXCC.

There are three club competition categories; Local 1 to 10 logs, Medium 11 to 50 logs and Unlimited at 50+ logs. We'll compete against other similar sized clubs. We'll find out what category we're in when all the logs are submitted.

Ten meters is opening up as cycle 24 comes to its peak(s) which should make this a fun contest. It has world-wide participation with numerous classes of CW only, SSB only, Mixed and Multi categories. If you have time, get on the air for some REDXA fun during the ARRL 10M contest. Rules are here: http://www.arrl.org/10-meter

We'll have to wait and see how we did in CQP. Kudos to all the members that participated! I hope everyone got their log submitted before the deadline. It appears we have an edge on paper. Thank you all for another fantastic effort.

I hope everyone found time to get on the air for the CQ WW CW contest. There was plenty of DX activity from around the world, with some pretty amazing scores being claimed. The CQ WW web site states they've received over 5000 logs, just 48 hours after the end of the contest. I was able to work quite a few new ones and had a lot fun from a little pistol station.

Don't forget about Getscores.org, it's a real time score posting website that accepts and displays score postings from contesters that choose to post there. It can add a little twist to your contest experience. Gerry, W1VE says Getscores is ready and running for the upcoming contest season.

You can view real time contest scores from stations submitting data during the contest. There are two methods for submitting data, There is a manual data entry window on the webpage or most logging program are providing interfaces for automatic live updates to the application. Gerry also has made some improvements in the display.

When you are viewing the results, you can now hover your mouse over the callsign, and the break down for that station will show in a floating, popup window. This feature does not work on the Test page, just live results.

Get Scores also utilizes social media and you can now keep track of Getscores activity and who's doing what using Twitter and Google+! Just follow getscores_live on Twitter, or follow / add "Getscores org" to your Google+ ring. You can filter tweets using the Cabrillo name of the contest: #CQ-WW-SSB for CQ World Wide SSB. During any live contest, you'll get tweets/posts showing who is leading (on Getscores) in each category. This feature is beta quality, and he'll be tweaking it over the coming months. MONACO, 3A. Special event station 3A60ARM is QRV during the month of December in celebration of the 60th anniversary of the Association des Radioamateurs de Monaco. QSL via bureau. I actually need this one...

SENEGAL, 6W. Mark, AA1AC plans to be QRV as 6W/AA1AC from Somone from December 8 to 14. QSL to home call.

AZORES CT8,. Siegfried, DF9WB, is now active as CT8/DF9WB from (EU-009) until December 18th. Activity has been on 20/15/10 meters SSB. QSL via his home callsign, direct or by the Bureau.

BARBADOS, 8P. Look for Mike, KI1U, Mike, N1TA and Bruce, K0BJ to be QRV as 8P9IU, 8P9TA and 8P9BJ, respectively, from December 9 to 16. Activity will be on 160 to 2 meters including 60 meters and straight keys, using CW, SSB and RTTY. They may also be active on Satellite SO-50. They will be QRV as 8P8T in the upcoming ARRL 10 Meter contest. QSL all calls via KI1U.

MALTA, 9H,. Leo, DJ7PR, is once again active as 9H3YQ from Malta (EU-023) until December 11th. Activity is holiday style and has been mostly 40 meters CW this past week. However, Leo informs OPDX, "My antenna is a small vertical for all bands built up on my balcony and I only work CW. With 100 watts and CW, it works perfect. Also for DX. My working hours are mostly in the evening which means 1700-2300 GMT and mostly 20m and 40m. I don't think it is a good time for USA. I also try 10m between 0900 and 1200 GMT if the band is open." QSL via his home callsign.

CHILE, CE. A group of operators are QRV as XR150CBS during the month of December to commemorate the 150th Anniversary of the Santiago Fire Department. Activity is on all HF bands using SSB and various digital modes. QSL via XQ7UP.

NIUE, E6. Operators Alan, VK4WR and Graeme, VK4FI will be QRV as E6RQ and E6SG, respectively, from December 7 to 17. Activity will

be on 40 to 6 meters, with an eye towards good sporadic-E and TEP propagation into Asia. QSL both calls direct via VK4FI.

NEW CALEDONIA, FK. Freddy, F5IRO will be QRV as FK8RO from Ouvea Island, IOTA OC-033, from December 9 to 13. Activity will be on 40 to 10 meters using CW. QSL to home call.

SVALBARD, JW. (Update to

OPDX.1139/Callsign). Alex, PY2SEX/DL1NX, informs OPDX that he just got permission from Norwegian Post Communication Authority to use his home callsign as LA/PY2SEX and JW/PY2SEX. So look for Alex to be active from Svalbard (EU-026) during Christmas (December 24-25th) for only those two days as JW/PY2SEX. QSL via DL1NX with SAE and a valid IRC or 2 green stamps.

XW, LAOS. Champ, E21EIC, will once again be active as XW0YJY from Vientiane between December 12-17th. Activity will include the ARRL 10M Contest (December 14-15th) as a Single-Op/Mixed-Mode/Lower-Power entry. Operations before and after will be CW on 80-10 meters. BULGARIA, LZ. Members of the Radio Club Blagovestnik are QRV as LZ867MWB during December to honor St Mihail Voin. QSL via LZ1KCP.

EASTERN KIRIBATI, T32. A group of operators are QRV as T32RC from Christmas Island, IOTA OC-024, until December 11. Activity is on 160 to 10 meters using CW, SSB and RTTY. This includes an entry in the ARRL 160 Meter contest. QSL via N7RO.

T33A LOG/QSOS UPDATE. The T33A team has just compiled the final logs from the island and uploaded them to Clublog on November 29th. This upload does not reflect corrections that are presently being made via the inquiries sent to the QSL Manager. The QSL Manager is working to clear all the inquiries and then will upload that new file upon

conpletion. He expects to clear all inquires by mid to late December and will upload that file. To those with missing calls or possible busted calls, they'd recommend patience prior to making an OQRS request and allow the QSL Manager to complete the inquiries that he receives. Please visit Clublog occasionally to see if the corrections have been implemented for those with inquiries. The E-mail for contacting the QSL Manager (W2IJ) is <Banaba2013@outlook.com>. To all with questions please forward your concerns to that E-mail address. He has now begun to respond to those inquiries. The QSLs won't be ready for at least 6-8 weeks.

MICRONESIA, V6. Haru, JA1XGI is QRV as V63XG from Chuuk, IOTA OC-011, until December 12. Activity is on 160 to 10 meters using CW, SSB and RTTY. This includes an entry in the ARRL 160 Meter contest. QSL to home call.

SOUTH SHETLAND ISLANDS, RI20,. To celebrate the 20th anniversary of the Russian Robinson Club (RRC), RRC club members/operators Alexander/RW3RN (RRC #256??) and Oleg/UA3HK/ZS1OIN (RRC #349) will be active as RI20ANT from the Russian Antarctic station "Bellingshausen" on the Island of King George (AN-010) between December 17-31st. Activity will be mainly on 20 meters using CW and SSB. Equipment is a Yaesu FT-1000MP transceiver and an all band antenna. QSL via RW3RN. At the Bellingshausen station, the beacon RI1ANG works around the clock on frequency 14101 kHz. If the beacon is heard, you can then callsign RI20ANT on frequency 14160 kHz \pm QRM. For more information about the Russian Bellingshausen station, read the article written by its chief Oleg Neruchev (RI1ANU) "Antarctica, 58th RAE" in the journal "Radio" issue number 10 dated 11/2013 at:

QSOs with RI20ANT count for the "Russian Robinson Club - 20 years" Jubilee Diploma and are worth 3 points (repeatable on different bands), and count for the rule of having one mandatory contact with the main jubilee callsign R20RRC. Those who did not make the contact with R20RRC have a chance to make it before the end of the year with RI20ANT. Rules for the RRC-20 diploma can be seen on <http://www.robinsons.ru/>. VIET NAM, XV. Mats, is QRV as XV2LRR from Phan Tiet until December 14. Activity is holiday style on 40 to 10 meters using CW and SSB. QSL via LoTW.

Propagation

Solar activity bounced back this week, with average daily sunspot numbers increasing from 63.6 to 102.9, and average daily solar flux from 130 to 132.9. There were no periods of disruptive geomagnetic activity, although November 30 and December 1 were slightly unsettled. There was another uptick in activity yesterday, December 5, when the solar flux readings at Penticton were 157 at 1800 UTC, 149.6 at 2000 UTC and 156 at 2200 UTC. The daily reading at 2000 UTC (local noon in British Columbia) is always the official solar flux value for the day. The sunspot number for December 5 was 103, up from 98 the day before.

Predicted solar flux for December 6-7 is 155, on December 8-9 it is 150, then 145 on December 10-11, 135 on December 13-14, 130 on December 15-16, 135 on December 17, 130 on December 18-19, 125 and 130 on December 20-21, 125 on December 22-23, 130 on December 24-26, and 125 on December 27-28.

There is an odd solar flux peak at 165 predicted for January 8, but this seems to be a remnant of a prediction from November 25 through December 1, when there were many days in mid-December, late December and early January with solar flux predicted at 160-165. On December 2 these predictions were radically revised downward, with the exception of January 8. From November 25 to December 1 the solar flux prediction was 165 for January 4-10, but starting on December 2 that prediction was revised to solar flux at 130 on January 4-7 and 135 on January 9-10 and 130 on January 11-12, with January 8 standing alone at 165.
