Excitement in Ham Radio

What keeps you interested in ham radio? Well, one of the things I found out that really excites me is contesting. I have been a casual contester for the last several years, mainly to pick up DX as I was working for my DXCC 100 award. My best contest so far was the CQ WW WPX contest. This is a 48 hour contest where amateurs around the world contact as many other amateurs and prefixes as possible. I started the contest Friday afternoon soon after it started. I had planned on working maybe 4-5 hours of the contest over the weekend. Well, by Sunday afternoon I had set in front of the radio for a total of 19 hours and made 347 contacts, 338 of which were DX stations.

After the contest I thought about why I spent so much time in the contest. I realized that contesting for me was much like taking my boat out through

the Golden Gate into the Pacific Ocean salmon and tuna fishing. That was challenging and sometimes



conditions made it quite exciting coming back in through what is known as the “potato patch.” That is area just off of Pt. Bonito what becomes quite rough with outgoing tides, swell, and wind. In those conditions piloting my 26ft. catamaran took skill and knowledge of the water conditions in that area. That skill and knowledge was developed over 35 years of going out the gate in the boats I have owned. Alas my ocean boating days ended in 2012 when I sold my boat as it was time to find less physically challenging activities.

Contesting has let me experience some of that same excitement I got in running my boat in challenging conditions. Contesting is challenging in its own way. Picking out the contact in the QRM, getting the exchange right, and logging it correctly, that is exciting for me when I can accomplish that. I learn more about my radio, how to set filters, etc. and when the various bands give me the best propagation from my QTH. I learn more about operating techniques and my logging software with each contest.

I know contesting is not for everyone and some operators even complain about the bands being taken up during contests. I doubt I will ever become a serious contester as some are, but for me it’s another aspect of amateur radio that keeps my interest. There are many contests on throughout the year. The ARRL lists their contests in QST and on the ARRL website. The WA8BNM contest calendar at (<http://www.hornucopia.com/contestcal/weeklycont.php>) is a good source of contest information.
