

CLUBLOG and REDXA

Over the years I have found Club Log to be a very useful tool to track DXCC entities. There are many tools that not only to show your own personal performance by band and mode but also how REDXA performs as a DX oriented club.

I have always found it interesting to see how REDXA ranked among the other Radio Clubs using the "Club League" feature. Historically REDXA has been in the top 25 percent of the clubs listed.

Just recently I noticed REDXA was no longer included in this list. Reviewing the rules I discovered clubs with fewer than 15 active members are not shown in the "Club League Tables".

Clearly, REDXA has more than the required number of club members but the catch is to be included in the Club League tables there must be at least 15 "Active" members.

There are two classes of club members used in the Club Log tables. Registered Members and Active Members. REDXA currently has 37 registered members and of those only 13 are currently active. To be considered currently active, a member must have uploaded their logbook contacts that show recent activity within the preceding 12 month period.

The easiest way to satisfy this requirement is to use logging software that automatically uploads each QSO as it is made. Most logging programs now offer uploads to both LoTW and Club Log.

Note from Club Log: Members must add themselves to the club. Instruct them to click 'Settings' and then go to the 'Clubs' tab to join. This method allows users to opt-out (by default) of leagues and DXpedition charts. The opt-in principle is how Club Log is intended to work. To comply with GDPR privacy laws, email addresses are not revealed.


