Back to the Marin Rod and Gun Club for Field Day 2022

Field Day "In-Person" is Back!

After two years of COVID cancellations of Field Day, it looks like we will be returning, along with our friends at the Marin Amateur Radio Society to the Marin Rod & Gun Club, just as we have done for many years in the past! This, of course, is assuming that there are no new COVID outbreaks or any other disasters that may befall us between now and then. The dates to circle on your calendars are:

Friday, June 24 for setup

Saturday, June 25 for operation, starting at 11:00 am PDT through 11:00 am Sunday

Sunday, June 26, end of operation and teardown after 11:00 until we are done around 2:00 pm

Our intent is to run as a 3A entry with one each phone, CW and FT-8/4 stations. Assuming we have enough helpers, we should be able to run the same compliment of antennas that we have run in previous years. This year, I want to improve on the performance of our SteppIR BigIR vertical by using 16 30' radials which will require us to develop a "Team Vertical" of three or four folks to erect the antenna and spread out the radials. In addition to our normal station captains, we will need a volunteer to be the Team Vertical captain to supervise the setup and teardown of the antenna. If you're interested in taking that on, please let me know!

There will be some important changes that we will need to observe since we will probably not be 100% free of COVID by the third weekend in June. Some of these points are required by our MR&GC contract and others are just common sense:

We will have to compile a list of all people who will be attending the event along with their phone numbers and proof of COVID vaccination. All attendees must be vaccinated!

We will have to appoint a 'Covid Compliance Officer' (CCO) who will be on duty to verify all vaccination cards.

Anyone with a fever, any other COVID symptoms or who has been recently exposed to someone with COVID should not attend.

Hand sanitizer will be provided at each of the operating positions.

Disinfectant spray will be located at each of the operating positions and ops will be encouraged to spray all microphones, headsets, code keys, keyboards, mice and radio knobs when starting a shift.

We will observe all county and state masking or social distancing requirements if any still remain.

As we have done in the past, I will be taking reservations for operating times in advance, so if you have a preference, please email me, or sign up when you arrive on-site.

I will be happy to discuss more about this at our big 'return to live' monthly REDXA coming up March 19th at the Boulevard Cafe. Field Day 2022 will be our big return after two years of the solitude and loneliness of 1D class operating, so I'm hoping we have a huge turnout and make up for all of our lost fun, excitement and good times with old friends...I hope to CU there!














Parks on the Air of the month. A new column from our travelling treasurer?



Editor's Note:
Visitors to our part of the world frequently ask about visiting Muir
Woods. Here's a suggestion.
Take them to Armstrong
Woods. The trees are just as big there with fewer parking hassles.

On March 1 I decided to do a local Parks on the Air activation at K-3398 Armstrong Redwoods Reserve State Conservation Area (formerly known as Armstrong Woods State Park). I paid my day use fee of \$9 (a senior discount of \$1 whoopee) And drove to the picnic area in the back of the park. This unfortunately is a less than ideal spot for radio as it is in a deep canyon surrounded by some VERY BIG trees. With no internet connection I was unable to "self spot" on the POTA Web site and had to rely on the Reverse Beacon Network. I got on 20 CW and called CQ a couple of times and got a one call from NE. I thought maybe things would go ok but that was my last QSO on 20. Switching to 30, I had one Q with OR and then nothing again. So, I tried 40 and I managed 5 cw qsos and 3 ssb. 1 OR and the rest CA. In almost 2 hours I managed a total of 10 QSO: ! Not what I was hoping for but I did get the minimum 10 qsos to get credit for an official " activation". This is the closest park to my home so I hope to return for another try. There is a road that does lead to a higher elevation part of the park but it is currently still closed due to damage from the Walbridge fire of 2020.




